CDTSA Service Rifle Rules

Stock Class

All rifles and carbines must have been issued to any military past or present. You can make any changes you want to your gun, but it must remain in its original military caliber. No optics, No red dots and No target sights. Iron sights must be as-issued or battle sights. Filing of front sight is permitted for zeroing. Triggers cannot be less than 3.5 lb.

35 rounds per match at 100m.

Open Class

All Rifles and Carbines must have been issued to any military past or present. You can make any changes you want to your gun, but it must remain in its original military caliber. Scopes are permitted up to 4 power. Variable scopes that exceed 4 power are not permitted. Triggers cannot be less than 3.5lb.

40 rounds per match. 30 rounds at 100m. 10 rounds at 200m.

Vintage Class

All Rifles and Carbines must be as-issued, to the common soldier, to any military prior to 1956. There are no modifications allowed of any kind. No scope or target sights. Iron sights must be stock/as issued. Filing front sight is permitted for zeroing.

25 rounds per match at 100m.

General Rules

Replicas or civilian variants are permitted, but they must be in original caliber. For example: AR15 in 223 is permitted, but an AR15 in 6.5 Grendel is not.

There are no bipods or artificial rests of any kind allowed. Mags may be rested upon when deemed okay by R.O.

Spotting scopes and spotters are not permitted at any time.

Center fire cartridges only. No rim fires.

No sniper rifles.

Slings must be of issue pattern or equivalent for the rifle in question. Slings used in target rifle competition are not permitted. No padding. Only one or two point slings are permitted.

Ear and eye protection must be worn at all times during the match.

Any violations of these rules will result in a disqualification.

Precision/ Tactical Rifle

This class is open to any bolt or semi-auto rifle. In any center fire caliber other than 50 BMG. Your rifle must be able to hold a minimum of 4 rounds.

Any scope with any magnification is permitted.

Only a folding Harris type bipod is permitted. No sandbags, or rear rest.

No spotters or spotting scopes.

You will need 15 to 25 rounds per match.
